
Old Mill is Landmark



HILDEBRAND MILL, known as Beck's mill, is located one-half mile north of highway 33 on Flint Creek and was established in 1835. The millstones were shipped from France to New Orleans, up the Arkansas River by boat to Fort Gibson, and then on to the millsite by ox wagon. This old mill furnished meal for the Indians and whites over a 50 mile radius for over a century.

During the Civil War. Union forces captured the mill and used it as a Confederate prison. The

prisoners had smallpox and it vas the Cherokee Nation. scattered for miles around by Indians who came to get meal.
